ROSARY is prayed before Mass each Sunday morning beginning at 10:05 a.m.

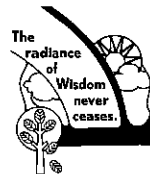
EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION is offered in our parish on Mondays from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m.
