As of today (August 12th) there are 143 people incarcerated in Clay County.

In years past, St. Francis de Sales parish had taken the lead in ministering to those in jail—given their proximity to the facility. We are currently hoping to expand that ministry and inviting all parishioners from our area parishes to [St. Francis de Sales, St. Joseph, St. Elizabeth, St. Andrew, St. John the Baptist (Georgetown)] to help us minister to those incarcerated here in Clay County.

The kick-off and training for this ministry is in the planning stages, but I can tell that at some point in the coming weeks, an opportunity for training volunteers will happen. As I get more details I will share them with you. I myself will be joining with you in the training.

I would ask all of you, whether you are interested in participating in this ministry or not, to:

- 1) pray for those who are currently detained, and pray for the success of this ministry.
