TODAY'S READING



Sometimes the sayings of Jesus seem far removed from reality. Consider Luke 12:32-40: 'Do not fear, little flock. Sell everything - give to the poor where your treasure is, there is your heart.' Sell everything?!! And then how do we feed ourselves, who will

give us shelter? But this sticky question shows us the true power of this lesson: It's the attitude, not the act Jesus is truly looking for. Every day we struggle to set priorities. What goes first on the list? God? Missions? Our parish? No, sadly, it's usually paying bills, running errands, social activities. That's the problem. If we could only manage to put God at the top of the list, we'd have the attitude right. There would be no reason to sell off all our other priorities if God already has His rightful place. Take a good, hard look at your list today. Could it stand a little revision?

Jesus encourages us to build up our treasure in heaven. The world encourages us to build up our treasure in real estate, investments, and material goods. 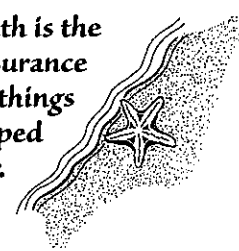
