## **TURKEY DINNER NEWS – A PARISH EVENT**

Following is information pertaining to our Turkey Dinners. Our intent is to make our dinners successful, fun, and fair for all parish members.

1. For each dinner, one group of people receives a letter asking them to be on the Cleanup Committee. However, everyone in the parish is expected to help with other aspects of the dinner even though you receive no notice. This means you would work at three dinners a year but only stay for cleanup once every approximately three dinners. You are expected to find a replacement for cleanup if you are unable to be here.
2. If you take bread for the dressing, please cube it, dry it (this step is very important), put it back in the bread bags, and return it to the church before the following Saturday evening. (directions will be provided)
3. Volunteers are needed to roast turkeys and dressing (directions will be provided). Please offer your assistance and sign up on the sheet in the gathering area. Turkeys can be picked up at the church on Saturday, and dressing is prepared after the Saturday evening Mass.
4. Help is needed on Saturday morning, the day before the dinner. We clean turkeys, cut up vegetables, and begin preparation for the dinner. If you can help, we begin at 9 a.m.
5. Relishes you might donate include a variety of pickles and olives, fresh veggies (carrots, celery, radishes, cauliflower, broccoli), and items to add color such as spiced apples or cinnamon stick pickles.
6. Salads should fill the equivalent of a 5-qt ice cream pail. Please do not bring jello as it melts into everything else on the plates.
7. Desserts are either 2-9x13 pans or 1 jelly roll-size pan. **Please avoid plain cakes.** We have spoiled our customers, and they look for fancier desserts!
8. **MASS IS ON SATURDAY EVENING AT 5 P.M.** Our Saturday night crowd is usually quite small. It really cuts into our dinner profit if half the profit must be used to make up what didn't come in the collection. If you are gone on Saturday, please make every effort to "catch up" the next week.
9. Can't possibly make the dinner or provide your food? We know that can happen. A monetary donation would be greatly appreciated!

Our dinners started over 20 years ago (when we did a minimum of 5 a year) as a way to make our building payments. They still play a large role in our budget. They pay our church cleaners and other incidental costs. More importantly, however, we feel they are a real community builder for our own church and a wonderful public relations tool. In addition, local charities receive 15 percent of each dinner profit. Please continue to support them in any way you can.
