Lent presents a special time to focus on our relationship with God. We spend much time discussing how to live properly during Lent. Should we fast and on what days? Is doing Christian service more valuable than a personal sacrifice of food or fun? And while these questions are worth

consideration, their focus may be a bit too narrow. Instead take a moment to consider Matthew Henry's quote: "The whole life of a Christian should be nothing but praises and thanks to God; we should neither eat nor sleep, but eat to God and sleep to God and work to God and talk to God." An excellent recipe for Lent and our daily Christian walk.

The Mass

Early this morning Bishop Hoepfner directed all the priests to cancel all public celebrations of the Holy Mass. I will continue to celebrate the Mass at St Andrew's and St Elizabeth's, just that you will not be there.

I will offer the Masses at 9am as usual on Mondays and Wednesdays at St. Elizabeth's, and offer the Mass on Tuesdays and Thursdays at St. Andrew's. Additionally, I will offer Mass on Fridays and Saturdays at 9am from St. Elizabeth's. The intentions scheduled in the Parish Bulletins will be offered as usual, and my intentions for the Friday and Saturday Masses will be for the health and welfare of all. I'll offer Mass at 9am Sundays and 10:30am Sundays at St. Elizabeth's and St. Andrew's as usual.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

I will be available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation (confession) as much as I am able in our parishes. Please look for additional times and days (over and above those times that we had already scheduled) to come out in the next day or so.

As we have all seen, the situation continues to change, and the parish staff and I do our best to keep you up to date. As I said above, be sure to check our website, FaceBook pages, and your email for additional information as it becomes available.
