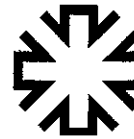

**FAMILIES WITH SMALL CHILDREN**

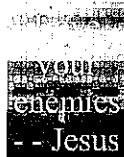
Please know that the gathering space is available for families with small children, and the speakers are on so you can see and hear the Mass.

**TODAY'S GOSPEL READING**



In today's Gospel from Matthew, Jesus continues his teaching that expands the law. He continues the "You have heard it said, but I say" motif and calls us beyond any idea of revenge and to love-- not only our neighbor--but our enemies. In our world today, where

there are wars and acts of terrorism and acts of violence toward the vulnerable, whom do we consider our enemies? Some would name our opponents in wars; some would say terrorists; some are naming immigrants as the enemy. It is easy to love those who love us, but Jesus asks us to do so much more! In fact, he asks us to be perfect.

**STEWARDSHIP**

*"But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you..."*

*(Matthew 5:44)*

Love your enemies, easier said than done, no doubt. But, remember, the foundation of stewardship is prayer. When we are in close communication with God, it opens our heart and it turns our attention away from "me" and moves it towards God and others. It allows us to have a little more empathy for "our enemy." When we pray for others, even "our enemies," maybe it softens their hearts as well.

**LIFE** – May every human person, from conception to natural death, be recognized as a temple of God, in whom the Spirit dwells.

**VOCATION** – "Be holy, for I, the LORD your God, am holy." Is your vocation to holiness to be lived out as a priest or in the consecrated life?
