One can also keep the day holy by viewing Mass on television (Sunday – Channel 6 at 10:30 a.m.; EWTN at 7:30 a.m. and 11 a.m.), listening to Mass on the radio, making a spiritual Communion, praying the Liturgy of the Hours, praying the Rosary, or another devotion. If you have a spiritual emergency, you may call (218) 287-2705 and follow the recorded instructions in order to contact Father. Father remains available for spiritual emergencies (confessions and Anointing of the Sick), by appointment.

TODAY'S GOSPEL READING



We have all had it happen. In the middle of a conversation we get the nagging feeling someone is "making a point." Is it me, we wonder, are they saying this for my benefit? It's awkward and rather embarrassing. We look around wondering if the message is meant for someone else

instead. Squirming in our mental chairs we wish we could blurt out, "hey are you talking to me?" Strange to think the same thing happens when God speaks. On Jordan's banks the crowd heard John's call to repentance. "One is coming," John said, "who will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." Conscience-pricked the crowd wondered, hey, is he talking to me? And then gloriously God's voice declared: "You are my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased." Now, God already knew that. Jesus knew it. So why say it? Because *we all* need to hear it. We need to know that God's message of forgiveness is for us, not the guy standing next to us. Before we can ask He answers. "Yes," He says, "I'm talking to you!"

ORDINARY TIME IN THE CHURCH

Next week we begin what is called "Ordinary time" in the Church calendar. Ordinary does not mean plain or simple. It means "numbered" as in first, second, etc., the ordinal numbers. This was the original sense of the word. Since we are not celebrating major feasts like Christmas or Easter, this title has come to represent a less spectacular or more "average" period in Church celebrations. Because of the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we do not hold a specific 1st Sunday in Ordinary time. It is used for the weekday Masses where no feast or memorial is observed. The numbers are meant to remind us that we are working toward a goal. Our life has a purpose. We are moving toward an ultimate Sunday. That will be observed in heaven when we are joined with the whole company of the saints and angels.

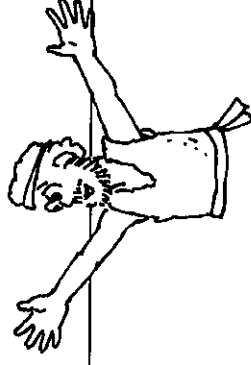

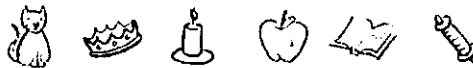

**St. Justin
Martyr**

(Feast Day
June 1)
100 - 165

St. Justin Martyr was born in Flavia Neapolis (present day Nablus, about 30 miles north of Jerusalem) around the year 100. He was born a pagan and educated in philosophy. At the age of 30, he happened to cross paths with an old man walking along the beach who questioned him about his beliefs and especially about the sufficiency of philosophy as a means of attaining truth. Over time, Justin had been persuaded of the superiority of the Christian creed over all other beliefs and philosophies, and seen this belief made manifest in the witness of Christians.

Martyrdom was for him the highest proof of the truth of Christianity. Nobody, he said, died for the teaching of Socrates. Justin's heart burned within him as he realized that he had finally found the Truth he had searched for all his life.

Much like St. John the Baptist, Justin was a great apologist (defender of the faith), engaging in debates with scholars. He wrote numerous works about the faith. For his staunch adherence to the Christian religion, Justin (like John the Baptist) was beheaded in Rome in the year 165.

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Ramaki (Water chestnuts wrapped in bacon)

*As we celebrate Jesus' baptism by water,
enjoy this water chestnut recipe!*

- × 6-8 cans of whole water chestnuts
- × soy sauce
- × brown sugar
- × 2 packages of center cut bacon

Preheat oven to 350 F. Marinate the water chestnuts in soy sauce, overnight if possible. Put brown sugar in a bowl and cut each bacon slice into 3 pieces. First roll the marinated water chestnuts into the brown sugar and set them in a baking dish until you are finished with all the water chestnuts. Once you have finished your first step then wrap each chestnut in bacon, secure with a toothpick and place it back in the same baking dish. Bake at 350 F for 1.5 hours turning once midway.
