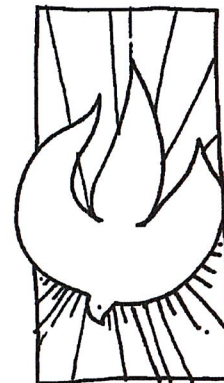

STEWARDSHIP

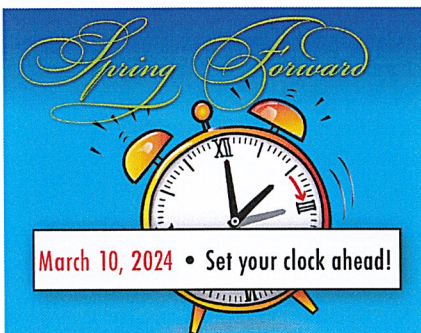
"You shall not carve idols for yourselves in the shape of anything..."

CHRISM MASS

The Most Reverend Andrew H. Cozzens invites all the faithful of the Diocese of Crookston to the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception for the 2024 **Chrism Mass at 6:30 p.m. on Monday, March 25**. Each year, the oils for sacramental anointing used in the diocese are blessed at the Chrism Mass. These oils include: the oil of the infirm, used for the sick and dying to give them strength to bear their suffering, resist evil and obtain forgiveness for sin; the oil of the catechumens, used to give strength to renounce sin and the devil; and the Sacred Chrism, the chief anointing oil, used at Baptism, Confirmation and Ordination as well as the anointing of altars and walls of churches being dedicated for Christian worship. Representatives will receive the blessed oils and take them to their parishes throughout the diocese. The priests of the diocese will also renew their promises to the bishop that evening. KC FISH FRY



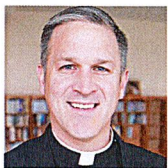

SPEAKER – Fr. Craig Vasek



The St. Andrew's Religious Ed youth would like to invite everyone to a parish-wide event on Wednesday, March 13, at 6:30 p.m. as we welcome Father Craig Vasek from the Diocese of Crookston. He will share his story of conversion and his growth of faith in the Holy Eucharist. We will be serving a delicious soup supper starting at 6 p.m. This is an event you won't want to miss!

Bio 2023

Father Craig Vasek is a priest of the Diocese of Crookston in Northern MN. Father studied for the priesthood at the Pontifical North American College in Vatican City, earning two degrees in theology from the Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aquinas. A few years later, Father Vasek complemented his Biblical and theological studies by obtaining a Master of Science in Psychology from Divine Mercy University, Arlington, Virginia.

In 2021, Father Vasek was chosen as one of fifty National Eucharistic Preachers for the National Eucharistic Revival in the United States of America. He was also appointed as a specialist for the Revival, serving at the headquarters of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops in Washington, D.C. During that time, Father was privileged to be part of a delegation which was received in private audience by the Holy Father to receive his apostolic blessing for the National Eucharistic Revival and 10th National Eucharistic Congress.

Father Vasek has worked extensively as a retreat director for Mother Teresa's religious community, the Missionaries of Charity, preaching retreats in Europe, Africa, and Asia.

He has also served as the Chaplain of Athletics at the University of Mary, as Program Director for the Institute of Faith, Virtue, and Sport, and as a faculty member in the School of Behavior Science and the School of Arts and Sciences.

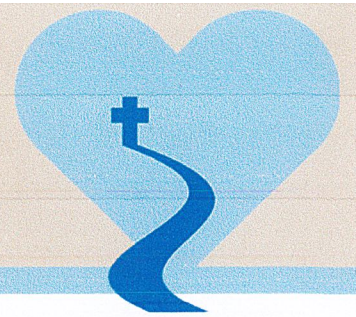

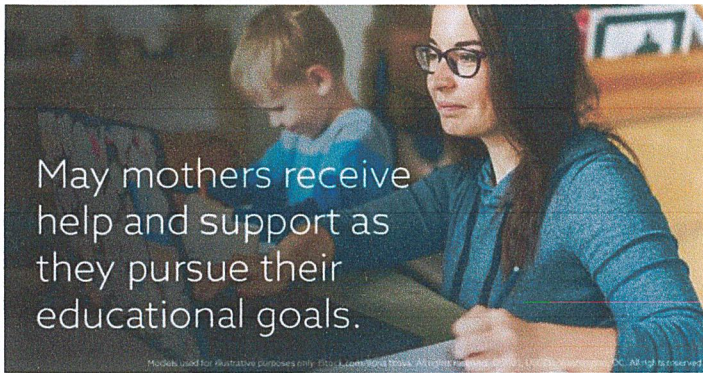

REFLECT

Sadly, our culture often pits a mother *against* her children, portraying a false “either/or” choice between her children and her dreams. Inaccurate messages spread the idea that a woman’s life is “over” once she becomes a mother.

But we know that countless young mothers have become unexpectedly pregnant and have continued to pursue education. And arguably, they do so not in spite of their children, but *because of their children*. Even if things don’t go exactly according to plan—timelines may shift, and dreams may change—the twists and turns can bring unexpected joy, purpose, and growth.

In *The Gospel of Life*, Pope St. John Paul II commends “brave mothers... who are ready to make any effort, to face any sacrifice, in order to pass on to [their children] the best of themselves” (EV 86). As members of the Body of Christ, we have a responsibility to help mothers do just that. And
