STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION:

"...proclaim the word, be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient..." 2 TIMOTHY 4:2

It is not always convenient to be a good steward, especially when all the temptations of our busy and materialistic world get in the way. Now add our own pride and ego into the equation and living a stewardship lifestyle may be downright uncomfortable! Remember, God didn't call us to be comfortable. He never said that we would have an easy life. Rather, He called us to be faithful!

Today's Reading

Imagine a parable with one purpose: to teach people that "they ought always to pray and not lose heart." Such was the parable Jesus told about the stern judge who was bothered by a nagging widow who felt she had been taken advantage of. The feisty little widow kept coming and coming before the judge insisting that she be given justice. Finally, becoming weary of her persistence, the judge granted her what she wanted. Is God like that stubborn judge who wants us to petition Him until He relents and grants us what we desire? Hardly. God loves us and wants the best for us. Still, it is important to pray persistently ... not to persuade God to see it our way; but to help us to "get it right," to see it God's way; to understand what God is already doing in the situation. "God," said Jesus, will "vindicate his elect, who cry to him day and night" (Luke 18:7). But it does take prayer, persistence, and never losing heart.

In 2025, **November 1st, the Solemnity of All Saints**, is **not** a Holy Day of Obligation for Catholics in the United States; the obligation to attend Mass on this day is lifted because it falls on a Saturday. While it's not obligatory, Catholics are still encouraged to attend Mass on All Saint's Day.

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day) on Sunday, November 2, 2025, replaces the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time. This means that the liturgical celebration for that Sunday will focus on All Souls' Day instead of the usual readings and prayers for the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time. You'll see specific prayers and readings designated for All Souls' Day during that Mass.

Saint Carlo Acutis

Feast Day of Saint Carlo Acutis was October 12. Please take a Saint Carlo Acutis prayer card home with you to pray with your family. They will be available at the Priesthood table. There's also more information about him on the Poster wall. 
Pilgrimage Invitation with Fr. Ilango

OVERVIEW:

Through the Pilgrim Icon Program, the Knights of Columbus councils organize a Sacred Heart Holy Hour featuring an icon depicting the most famous image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, painted in 1767 by Pompeo Batoni and now venerated in the Church of the Gesù in Rome. The reproduction bears the blessing of Pope Francis, through the Papal Almoner, and is one of more than 300 icons traveling across the world, from council to council, for veneration and use in prayer services.

The Sacred Heart Holy Hour includes readings from Sacred Scripture and reflections from Pope Francis on the Sacred Heart, as well as the Divine Mercy Chaplet, prayers to the Sacred Heart and time for silent prayer. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament may also be included. Following the holy hour, families are encouraged to enthrone the Sacred Heart in their homes by placing an <u>image of the Sacred</u> <u>Heart</u> in a place of honor and an enthronement ceremony.

Since the first traveling pilgrim icon of Our Lady of Guadalupe in 1979, more than 191,000 council and parish prayer services with some 23 million participants have been held.
