STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION: - 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established..." Luke 16:25-26

When God created the world He declared that it was good and He gave it to all mankind for us to enjoy. However, over the years we have created a chasm between those who have great gifts and those who do not. In today's Gospel we see that with our own generosity we must bridge that gap between those who have much and those who have little, or we may find ourselves on the wrong side of the chasm in the next life.

Today's Reading The parable of Lazarus and the rich man speaks to our hearts. In some ways, we may be able to identify with either of the individuals. In any event, we are asked to place ourselves into the scene and to ask some difficult questions if we identify ourselves with the rich man. How do we share the gifts and richness that we have? Are we blind to the needs of those who (although are not at our feet) are in front of our eyes, at our door, or on the street where we live? If we see ourselves as the poor man, do we see a hope for our resurrection into new life through and during our suffering? We all have a part to play in the drama of the spiritual journey, and Jesus calls us to the same happy ending into the Kingdom. How well do we respond to those needy at our door?


The International Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Our Lady of Fatima

Tour of Peace 2025

in the Diocese of Fargo

Traveling since 1947 after being blessed by the Bishop of Leiria-Fatima, on October 13. 1947, the statue left Fatima and was flown to America to begin its tours to bring the graces of Fatima to those many millions of people who may not otherwise have the opportunity to make a pilgrimage to Fatima itself. The bishop prayed that Our Lady's presence would travel wherever she went. It was



blessed again in 1952 by Pope Pius XII. who had crowned the original statue in Fatima as Queen of the world just a few years earlier. The International Pilgrim Virgin Statue has visited more than 100 countries. bringing Mary's powerful message of salvation and hope to millions. Countless favors and graces have been reported wherever the Virgin Statue has traveled.

Greetings to you all,

I have missed seeing you these past few weekends while I have been away. I understand that the first Turkey Dinner was a rousing success with nearly 500 guests served! That is awesome! A sincere thank you to all who helped. I also heard that Fr. Bob was very impressed with the number of individuals who came forward to be blessed as catechists last weekend. We are certainly fortunate that our religious education program is filled with so much vitality and excitement. It is clearly evident that the Holy Spirit is at work among the people of St. Andrews!

I am primarily writing to update you on a couple of issues within the parish.

As most of you know, Carlos Diaz, our parish office administrator, had a kidney transplant in the summer of 2020. Over the past few months, he has been having some severe side effects from his anti-rejection medication. Late this summer, his doctors prescribed some new medications and he has been suffering severe side-effects from those as well. Please keep Carlos in your prayers. The trustees of the parish and I are working with Carlos to provide some backup so that the essential tasks of our parish office can continue if Carlos needs additional time to focus on his health. We ask for your patience as we work through this process.

There has been some discussion in the parish regarding the possibility of doing some major remodeling and improvements in the parish hall as well as making some improvements to the sanctuary. Know that much of this discussion has been just that – discussion of possible needs within the parish in the long term. Rest assured that none of these projects will be undertaken without following proper parish and diocesan procedures. Prompted by a proposal to create a new classroom and upgrade the parish hall, Fr. Augie asked the pastoral council that it begin an assessment of long-term parish needs including repair and replacement of mechanical systems, building maintenance and upgrades, as well as any remodeling to better facilitate religious education and other parish activities. The pastoral council has begun that process and its first recommendation is to assure the parish has adequate financial resources to address any unforeseen emergency repairs (HVAC failures, etc.) before moving forward with any other projects. **No major renovations or improvements are imminent at this time** – it is not prudent or practical to initiate any such projects without a pastor present.

As an interim step, Fr. Augie did approve the repurposing of the parish conference room/library for use as a youth classroom/hangout room. That transition is beginning, but will not involve any structural changes to the building. The repurposing will include items such as paint, movable tables, a TV on the wall and removal of extra items from that room to make the space usable for RE/youth activities in the very near term. Note that the parish did receive a \$3,000 grant from the diocese to enhance religious education/youth space in our building. Some sort of soft seating will likely remain in the room to be used for comfortable family settings for funerals, weddings, or counseling sessions. We will provide further updates as we relocate the library resources to make sure that they remain available for parish

use. Once again, I ask for your patience as we work through the repurposing of this room and examine priorities for the future.

I view these items as minor growing pains of a parish that is striving to responsibly serve its current members while working to build up the kingdom of God here in Hawley. Please continue to pray that the Holy Spirit will inspire Fr. Augie while he is on his sabbatical and that the same Spirit will move and transform our parish into an even greater beacon of faith in our community.

I look forward to seeing you all at Confirmation next weekend. Please continue to pray for the 14 young men and women of our parish who will be confirmed in the Holy Spirit next week.
