To receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit you must open your heart and invite Him in! Ask the Holy Spirit to guide your thoughts, words, and actions every day! Be grateful for all the gifts God has given you! Regardless of our individual circumstances, God has given all of us many blessings. What we do with those gifts is our gift back to God! By generously sharing everything we have and everything we are, we become more “God-centered” and less “self-centered” and our lives truly reflect God’s light, love, and mercy.

**As the Father has sent me, so I send you. . .**

A dove is often the first symbol we learn of the Holy Spirit. The gentle beating wings of God’s love and power tapping at our heart. Then we learn that fire is also a symbol of the Holy Spirit, a burning power to share His message of love. Then we may recall the words of the prophet Joel: “I will pour out my spirit” and see the cool refreshing living water welling up in our hearts.

Why do we need all these different pictures for one simple truth? Because the Spirit is as diverse as we are. God’s Spirit must reach each heart individually and touch the sleeping potential to action. Can such divine inspiration come in just a one-size-fits-all? Some of us need a lulling voice, others respond only to a trumpet blare. The gentle touch to shepherd one, the stricter rod to guide others.

Because God loves each of His children equally, He has given us a Spirit that can be what we need, when we need it. Just as on the first Pentecost, the Spirit brought diverse tongues to carry God’s message of love and salvation to every heart, today He speaks to us in our own private language whispering the same words: “God loves you. He has a purpose for you. Go now and do.”

On **October 10th, 2026**, at the Alerus Center Ballroom in Grand Forks, ND, our Diocese will hold **Rescue Live**. The event will be presented by internationally known evangelist Fr. John Ricardo and his team from ACTS 29, a missionary ministry based in Detroit. *Rescue Live* will be a gathering of parishioners from across the Diocese of Crookston. Fr. Ricardo will share the Rescue Project, which proclaims the gospel in a compelling and attractive way, and Bishop Cozzens will lead us in prayer and adoration during the day. In June, registration will open nationwide and so it is important that you register soon so that everyone from our Diocese who wishes to go can attend. There is a \$50 entrance fee which pays for lunch and refreshments.
