In his encyclical *Dilexit Nos*, Pope Francis reminds us that our contemplation of the Sacred Heart must move us to live out this love ourselves, recognizing the face of Christ in our neighbors—especially those most in need.

To prepare our hearts and make this consecration a living reality in our community, our parish is launching a special spiritual campaign between **Sunday, June 7 (The Solemnity of Corpus Christi) and Sunday, July 5, 2026.**

For Youth



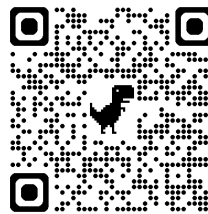
