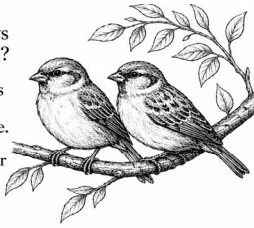

On Thursday, June 11, the U.S. Catholic Bishops **Consecrated the United States of America to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus on Thursday, June 11, 2026** and invited all faithful to join together in praying for the unity, healing, and restoration of our country. To prepare our hearts and make this consecration a living reality in our community, our parish launched a special spiritual campaign extending to **Sunday, July 5, 2026**. We ask our parishioners and those at St. Elizabeths to consciously make an effort to commit to works of mercy and time in Adoration of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. While we will not be documenting these hours of prayer and works, our goal would be to accomplish at least 250 combined hours of adoration and works of mercy.

Individuals and groups can participate in 250 Works of Mercy by engaging in the existing activities and efforts of our parish, getting involved in new ways, and by participating with local and national organizations on a weekly or monthly basis leading up to the July 4th anniversary.

Recall that we offer adoration at St. Andrews from 4 to 7 p.m. on Mondays. What a wonderful way to spend time with Jesus and to pray for the future of our nation.


