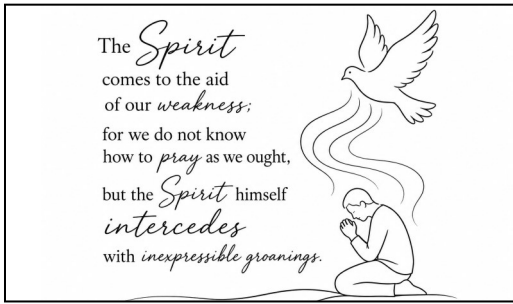

"All these things Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables. . ."

— Matthew 13:34

The 13th chapter of Matthew's Gospel is stuffed with parables, each one revealing a little more of the heart of God. When Jesus says, "The kingdom of heaven is like. . ." He could as easily have said, "God is like..." That's a cue for us to listen closely and then ask, "Now, what does this story say about God and how can I be more like Him?" The Parable of the Wheat and the Tares shows us God's infinite patience and mercy with the "bad seeds". He waits, giving every tender shoot a chance to grow straighter and stronger. That's a lesson we could all use. If we watered our hearts with more mercy and less judgment, we might grow into proud stalks of wheat instead of bitter shriveled tares.

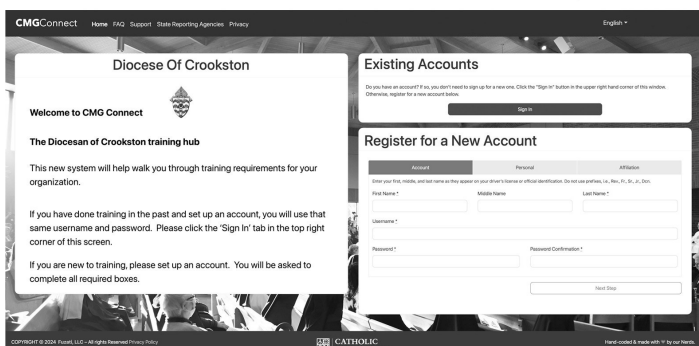

- **August 20-23 — Come Away, My Beloved: Women's Semi-Silent Retreat.** Our hearts are mad for love and to give love.
