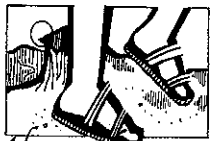

GOSPEL READING



He sent them out

So often we pray for God's protection as we head out for vacation. Yet are we really relying on Him for anything? We've tried to prepare for planned activities and emergencies. Often the only space left for God to affect our travels is when accidents don't happen. Perhaps there is a lesson to learn from the disciples as Jesus sent

them out. With empty pockets and only a walking stick, these early believers put total faith in God's ability to provide. They truly knew the meaning of "traveling mercies" dependent on Him for their very survival. And although today's Christian travelers wouldn't consider leaving our credit cards or suitcases behind, the question still stands: What are we depending on Him for?

STEWARDSHIP

"He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick – no food, no sack, no money in their belts."

Mark 6:8

Imagine taking nothing but a stick when you go on a trip. The Apostles must have really trusted in God's providential care. Think of all the material things "we can't live without" in today's world. We make our life's journey more difficult because of all the material baggage that we drag along. Putting God first in everything and putting our money and possessions second gives us freedom because we don't become "slaves" to wanting to acquire more things.

VOCATION

"Before the foundation of the world God chose us in Christ." Are you discerning the vocation that God has chosen for you in Christ? Might it be to serve the Church in the consecrated life or priesthood?

What is Reverence ?

When the priest enters the church for the procession, all should stand and remain standing until the priest begins. All should make a distinctive *Sign of the Cross* with the priest and do so with reverence not hastily, nor haphazardly, but carefully. When the priest invites the people to recall their sins, each one should silently examine his conscience, express sorry to God in one's soul and resolve to go to confession as soon as reasonably possible. If one has committed mortal sin since one's last good confession, this examination of conscience and the prayer to follow, does not suffice to admit one to Holy Communion. Before receiving Holy Communion, one must go to confession. It would be good to remember St. Paul's warning concerning the condemnation of those who receive the Eucharist unworthily. How many of our youth have lost the faith due to receiving our Lord in the Eucharist, unworthily? We should strive to participate with the people in making all the responses, according to our ability. It was St. Augustine who said, "He who sings well prays twice," so let's sing. We should think of the meaning of the words we say or sing, and join our intellects, our hearts and souls to pray with the church. We should not simply "hear" the Mass but "pray" the Mass, and that requires effort on our part. You don't accidentally give God reverence; it requires effort.

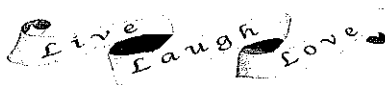
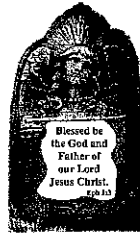

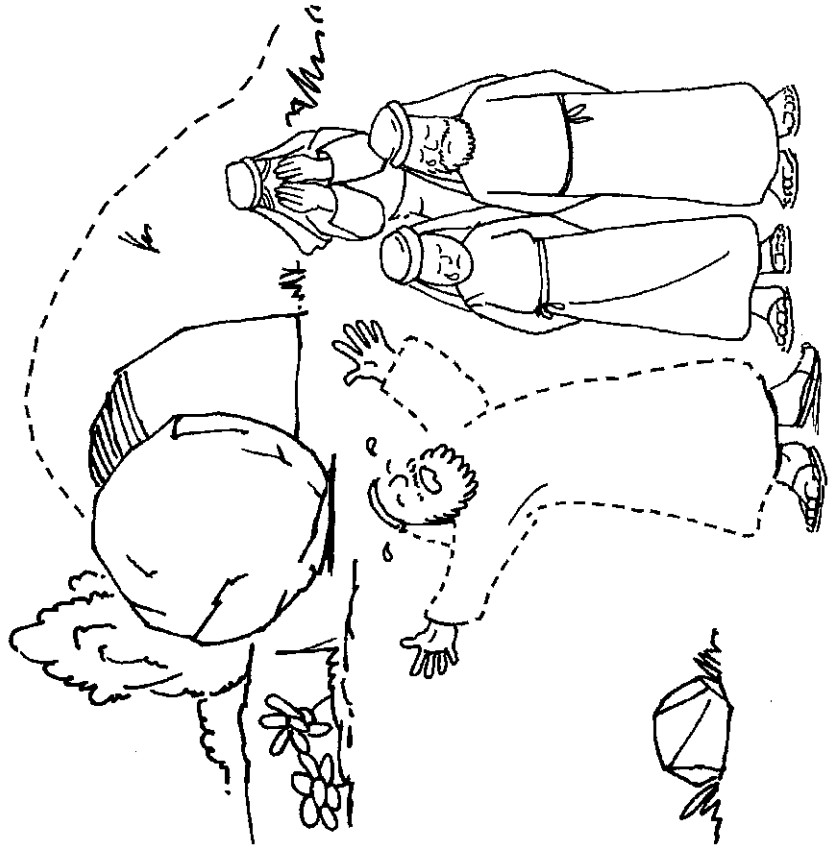
Made for Greatness Men's Retreat

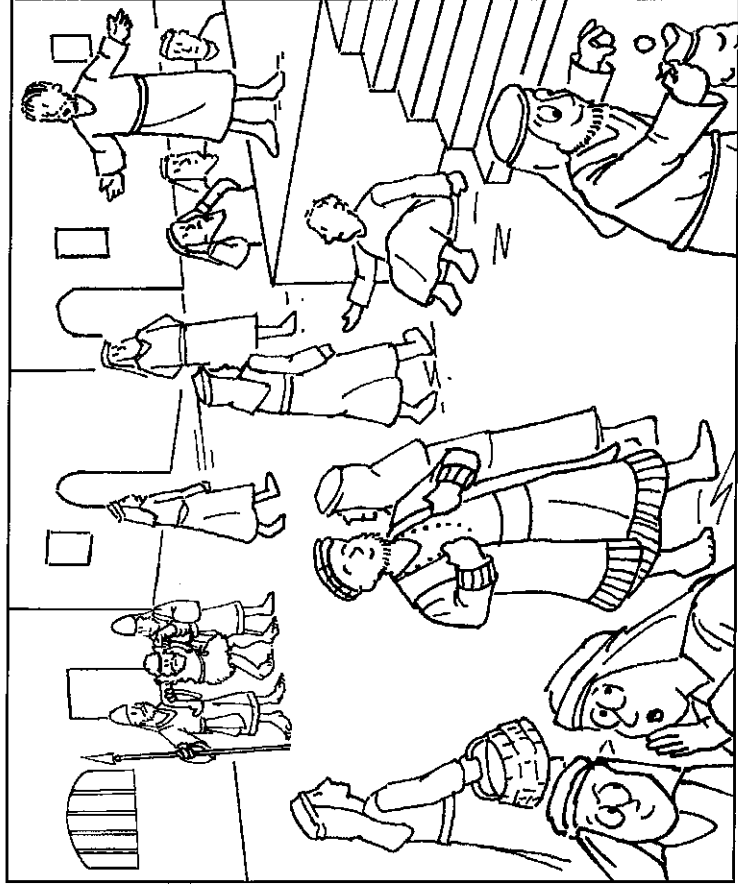

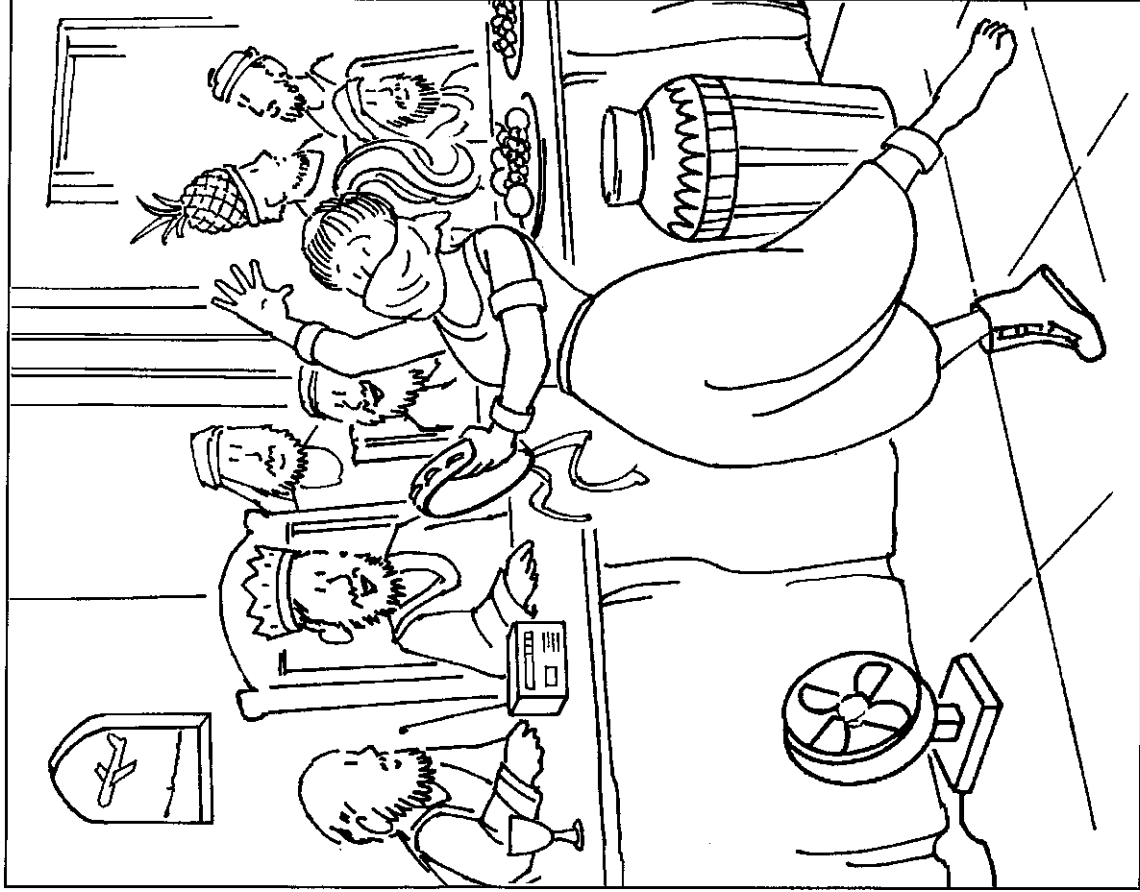
