GOSPEL READING

In a world focused on self-esteem, it's funny how self-conscious we still are. Look around the room the next time volunteers are asked for. You'll see at least two or three faces looking eager to help, but too embarrassed to offer. So their hands stay fixed in their laps and the opportunity passes. A re-reading of the miracle of the loaves and fishes might help. Two slightly smelly fish

and five sun-baked loaves were all that young boy had, yet he offered them to Jesus. All around him heads shook and laughter bubbled, what good would that mess do? But in the hands of a Master the smallest ingredients are enough. The faith of that boy to make a humble offering should shake our hearts today. What have we been keeping from the Lord, deeming it unworthy, too small to be of use? Offer it up today. God can and will make a miracle out of it and you.

Liturgy of the Word of God

During the Introductory Rites, all remain standing....Call to mind your sins with sorrow at the invitation of the priest. Strike your breast at the words "I have sinned through my own fault..." during the Confiteor or the "I confess" prayer as a mark of sorrow for sin. When the lector goes to the rostrum for the first Bible reading, SIT down. There are Scriptural readings from the Old Testament and New Testament at each Mass. These are read by the lector during which the people sit down and listen attentively. Christ speaks to us when the Scriptures are read. We must be open to letting the Word of God touch our hearts. As the priest approaches the pulpit all stand for the priest or deacon to proclaim the Gospel. When the priest begins by signing the cross on his forehead with his thumb, all should do the same. Trace the cross on your own forehead so that you may know and believe the Word of God; on your lips that you may profess the Word of God; on your heart that you may love the Word of God. After the Gospel sit down to listen attentively to the homily. If our hearts are open to our Lord, Jesus will speak to each person in some manner.

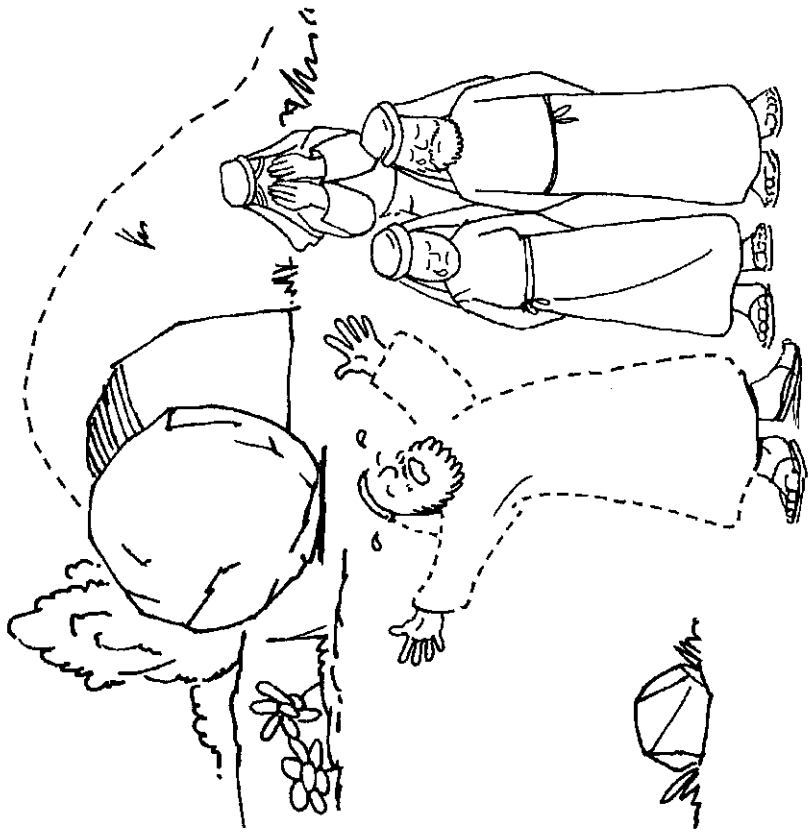

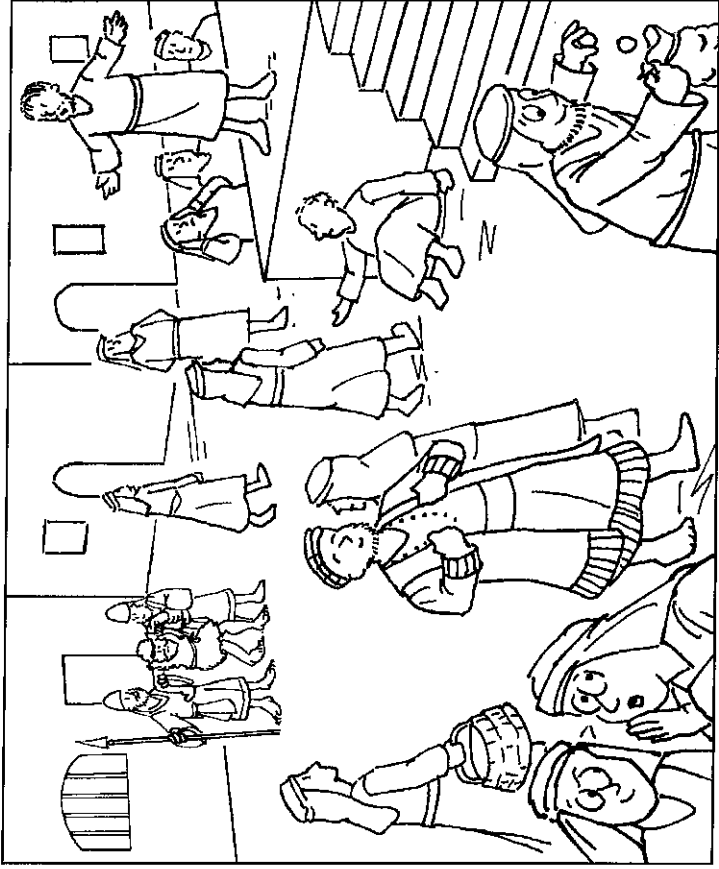

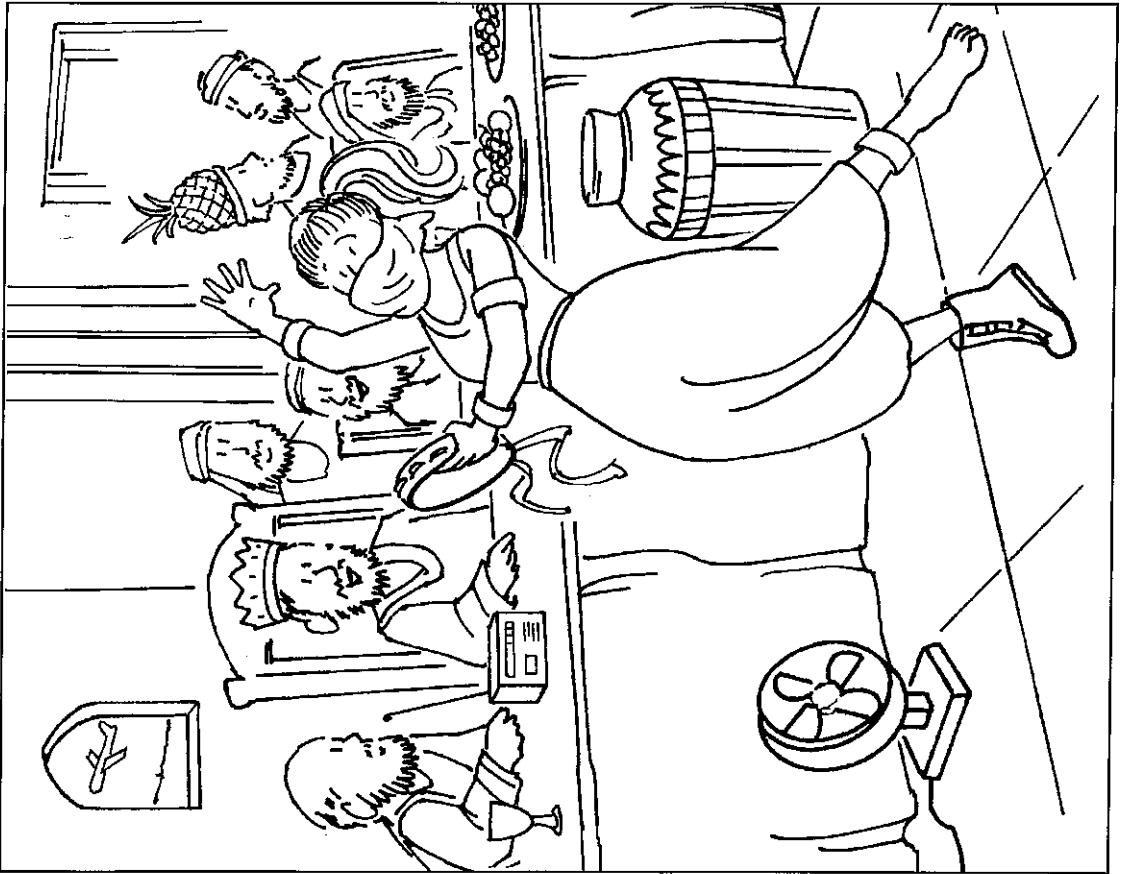
