STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION: - Palm Sunday of the Pas-
sion of the Lord

"...I tell you, Peter, before the cock crows this day, you will deny three times that you know me." (LUKE 22:34)

How many times have you heard someone make a disparaging comment about God or our Catholic faith? How did you react? Do you remain quiet so not to cause a disturbance? Or, because you don't want people to think negatively about you? Or, because you don't think you know enough about the Catholic faith? Pray for the courage to speak up and enter into a respectful conversation when the opportunity to talk about our faith arises. Joyfully share your faith with others.

Today's Reading:

The scribes, Pharisees, and Sadducees thought of Christ as a meddlesome troublemaker. Were they right? Sometimes, when we turn from the will of God and Christ challenges our consciences, we may think of Him as bothersome too. Occasionally Christ seems to become quite personal and quite disturbing. Remember at the Last Supper how He said that someone was going to betray Him? Because each of those present had already had times when they were shaky in their relationship with Christ, each one asked, "Is it I?" Today Christ uses our consciences to get personal and concerned about our loyalty. By remaining open to His teachings, and faithful to His Word, we can prove our faithfulness and remain completely true to Him.

The week between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday – HOLY WEEK – is the most sacred time of the year for Catholic Christians. During this time, we enter into the passion of Christ – his crucifixion, death and resurrection – through liturgical celebration and personal conversion. Lent officially ends and Triduum begins at dusk on Holy Thursday and continues through dusk on Easter Sunday. The Church teaches that the Triduum is one celebration that lasts for three days. During these three days we are called to gather together at church to celebrate and remember the saving action of Christ. ***This is one week in which we should not short-change God. He has given his life for us, so that we can live forever. We should observe this as a different kind of week, a truly HOLY week. We should participate in all of the reenactments of Jesus' last days before his death. If we spend time with him now, we can be certain that he will be there when we need him. Don't settle for a Reader's Digest version of Holy Week. For just this week, let's give God the unabridged version.***

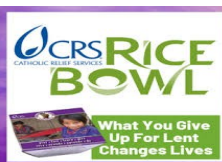
